

From The Pastor



"we who are strong ought to put up with the failings of the weak, and not to please ourselves..."

Romans 15:1-3

Paul apparently wrote the letter to the church in Rome as a form of instructions to those who were wrestling with the struggles that they faced and the resistance that the church experienced. It is interesting that Paul made the comment about "not to please ourselves." We understand that we are viewing

this many years after the letter was written and received.

And although time has changed, we human beings have not deviated very much from the behavior of our ancestors. Many of the things that we do, we do them to please ourselves, just as our ancestors did. Or we do them and that pleases us that we have done <u>something</u>. Paul went on to say that "Christ did not please himself, as it is written; the insults of those who insult you have fallen on me." In other words Christ carried the burdens of our sins and the words that people have spoken against or about us.

Sometimes the words still caused us pain because words harshly spoken are often meant to cause us pain. And although the pain did not last a lifetime for most people it caused some disruptions and distress in our minds, our thoughts and our lives. Those things are not new, for Moses experienced harsh words and rejection as he led the Israelites out of Egypt and on their way to the Promised Land.

At one point the people's complaints seemed directly pointed at Moses, and then Moses went to God and made his case for God to kill him and put him out of his misery. God told Moses that the people were really upset with Him (God). In each situation where Moses faced difficult situation - God came through for Moses.

If we go all the way back to Moses' experience with the burning bush, that was not consumed by the fire, up to Moses and his departure from the Israelites in the wilderness - God was there for Moses at all times. And Moses was doing what he did in obedience to God and for the sake of God's people, who were also Moses' people.

Moses was not the only person who did God's biddings for others. We could say the same thing for any of the prophets. We notice the same thing among the disciples. On and on throughout the courses of history, we can find examples of those whose work was not done for their pleasure, but was done in obedience to God's call and God's will.

The final statement concerning us is that we should be strong for those who are weak. We should come to their rescue especially when they are facing situations and people who mean them harm. We should pray for God to send out others who will stand up for the weak and undefended. Finally, we should always and in every way that we can come to the aid of all who are in need.

Let us pray,

Merciful Father, just as You have come to help and defend us, we ask that You might give us the courage and strength to come to the help and defense of those who need us.
