From The Pastor

"You are the salt of the earth; but if salt has lost its taste, how can its saltiness be restored? It is no longer good for anything, but is thrown out and trampled underfoot. "You are the light of the world. A city built on a hill cannot be hid. No one after lighting a lamp puts it under the bushel basket, but on the lamp stand, and it gives light to all in the house. In the same way, let your light shine before others, so that they may see your good works and give glory to your Father in heaven.

Matthew 5:13-16

Jesus was talking with the disciples. He was giving to them words that encouraged them as well as words that will challenge them. "You are the light of the world...You are the salt of the earth..." Jesus identified them and told them who they were. Then he challenged them to be who they were and work to make a difference for and among the people that they encountered.

As salt, they were to add flavor to the lives of those that they encountered. As light they were to illuminate the pathways of those to whom they were offering guidance. The challenge included a caution not to forget the one who made all things possible. "Let your light shine before others...and give glory to your Father in heaven."

God has endowed each of us with talents and gifts that we are to use to help others in their desire to get to know God, themselves and others. Because it is the understanding and knowledge about ones' own self that makes us capable of loving our neighbor as we love ourselves..." (Matthew 19:19-22). There are many times that we delude ourselves into believing that we love others when we don't fully understand what it means to love one's self.

For Jesus to love another as we love ourselves included being willing to lay down one's life for a friend. This expression of love includes being willing to sacrifice one's own selfish desire so that what we do is for the greater good, rather than self gain. Likewise being an example (a light) for someone else often times requires that we put aside our fears and doubts so that others might meet the giver of life and the creator of our new life in Christ.

Let's just take a moment to go back and think about the examples that Jesus set before us. He healed the sick, physically, mentally and spiritually. He gave sight to the blind, those who could not see or understand the messages from the Law and the prophets of the coming of the Messiah. He raised the dead, not only Lazarus and the widow of Nain's son, but those who were spiritually dead because they had lost their hope based on what the religious leaders and elders had told them. He fed the hungry, not just the five thousand on occasion and the four thousand on another, but when we find him teaching by the sea from a fisherman's boat or teaching on the side of a mountain, or even addressing the Samaritan woman that he met at the well who asked for the living water that he suggested that he would have given it to her had she asked him for water.

Maybe we are not doing such spectacular things as those that Jesus did, but God has endowed each of us with talents and gifts that we are to use to help others in their guest to get to know and serve God. What are the talents and gifts that God has bestowed upon us to use? Are we willing to accept the challenge to be the "salt of the earth" and the "light of the world" and make a difference is someone else's life? (It can be just a bit frightening, but our faith drives us on to use our talents and gifts.)

Let us pray,

Dear God, to you be the glory and may our work bring honor to your name.

Letter from the Council President

Don't Let Your Giving Go on Vacation

After reading this, if you think my topic for this Fishnet article sounds a lot like the May publication, you are correct. Although we reduced our overall spending budget for 2019, I continue to be concerned with us meeting our Giving required to support this budget. As we move into the summer months Giving typically drops off as many of us take vacations, enjoy weekend trips or outings with family and friends, or are generally not at worship as much. This isn't an effort to put a damper on your summer plans but rather my intent is to keep us mindful that maintaining our giving through this time is critical. Typically, monthly giving decreases by 10-15% from June through September. On the other hand, our core expenses (facility cost and staff salaries) continue at normal rates as our church operating costs never take a vacation.

With a 2019 Cash Needs Budget of \$243,000, we need average monthly giving \$20,000 to meet our cash needs. Year to date through May, giving is averaging about \$19,500 per month. On the positive side, our year-to-date expenses have been slightly less than expected, but this can change quickly with unexpected facility costs.

Our monthly giving for January - May is detailed below for your review.
