

From The Pastor

"Seek the LORD while he may be found, call upon him while he is near;"

Isaiah 55:6

We all have many different means by which we can contact and/or communicate with God. Some choose to spend time alone so that they can communicate with God. Giving and Cash Needs Update

The schedule below details our current Giving versus Cash Needs status as of the end of September 2019. Our average actual Monthly Giving through September is running 9% below the average Monthly Giving required to meet our Budgeted Cash Needs for the year. Please note that at this point in the year our expenses and cash needs are greater than our Giving by \$10,506. It is critical that all of us are aware of our current funding status and challenges as we move into the latter part of the church year. My sole intention with these monthly updates is to ensure that you are well aware of our church's financial status.
