

From The Pastor

"The hand of the LORD came upon me, and he brought me out by the spirit of the LORD and set me down in the middle of a valley; it was full of bones. He led me all around them; there were very many lying in the valley, and they were very dry. He said to me, "Mortal, can these bones live?" I answered, "O Lord GOD, you know." Then he said to me, "Prophesy to these bones, and say to them: O dry bones, hear the word of the LORD."

Ezekiel 37:1-4

In our devotional booklet "The Word in Season" from Wednesday, August 21, 2019, I came across these words, "Prophets did not predict the future, but they told what could happen if people kept on the path they were on. Prophets reminded people they had an alternative to following their own ways---they could rely on God, who is strong, loving, and readily available to them".

Upon reading this I wondered what the author thought or may have felt about the story of Ezekiel in the valley of dry bones. Was the message that God gave Ezekiel for the people of Israel who were in captivity, would he have considered that message a prediction of the future? Just how would we interpret that message that Ezekiel gave the Israelites?

Or once again when Jeremiah foretold of the Babylonian captivity that would come to an end some seventy years later in Daniels' life. How would the author of that announcement define that prophesy? Was it foretelling the future or not?

I am not trying to create an argument against the author of the above statement. However, such a bold statement can cause us to run head first into the statement from Philippians 4:13, where the record says, "I can do all things through Christ who strengthens me." If we allow this statement by the Apostle Paul to fit our lives as followers of Christ, then the prophets of God to whom we refer could use a similar proverb to fit their lives.

We can all respect the fact that there are people in our lives and in the world who can see what is going on and based on past events they can tell us what can or could not happen. But who is to say that God does not raise up prophets and people who can and do tell us things that will happen in the future regardless of our pasts. As people of faith we believe that God is able to do more than we can ask or think. And because God loves us and forgives us, God may choose to act in ways that we least expect.

Let us pray:

Merciful Heavenly Father, we stand before You in awe of Your majesty. There are still times when we don't fully understand the mystery of Your ways. But we do not let that get in the way of our gratefulness for all that You do for us. And for who You are we give you thanks.
